The new global world and the intellectual sources of the “neoconservative moment”. A Latinoamerican view.

One of the most elusive aspects, within the vast interpretations and the intellectual, political, cultural and existential shakes provoked by the Iraq war, has been the tremendous fact –and their repercussions- that the international politics scenario was displaced from exposing and dealing with an agenda of global problems, and its national and regional specifics, and returned to the theater of the hard military struggle for territorial occupation, and for the control of space and resources. Carl Schmitt, the German philosopher and thinker of the “decisionism” had already thought about all this and reached the brain of the main international power through the new neoconservative decision-makers of its foreign policy.
